Ten Guidelines for Staying Safe Online

1 **Avoid sharing personal**, contact, or banking information, photos, or any other details that could put you at risk or attract criminals.



2 **Do not share your location with people** you have just met online or do not know in person.



3 **Be careful with websites**, accounts, or people offering free gifts or items.



4 **Set your social media accounts to private.**



5 **Keep your passwords secret.** Use strong passwords and change them every six months.



6 **Do not accept friend requests** from people you do not know in person



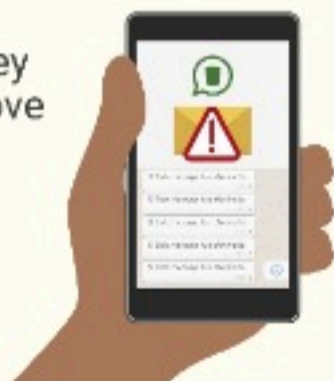
7 **Cover your computer camera** and use it only when necessary



8 **If you play games online**, do not share personal information.



9 **If someone deletes their messages while chatting**, be alert. They may be trying to remove evidence. Block and report the profile



10 **Check photos and videos carefully** before posting them online.
